Introduction

Objectives

Process

- The event began with a warm welcome and the felicitation of the guest, Ms. Radhika Marfatia, by Dr. Divya Soni Ma'am, Director, LJIMC. A Tulsi pot was presented to our guest as a symbol of grace, purity, and Indian culture.
- Ms. Marfatia addressed the students and faculty, sharing her journey through various dance forms and how

she uses dance to express unspoken emotions. She highlighted how body language, rhythm, gestures, and expressions act as non-verbal tools of communication.

- She then performed a live sequence without any music, using only facial expressions, hand gestures or mudras, and body movements to tell a story beautifully illustrating the core message of the session.
- The session was interactive, with students asking thoughtful questions about dance, expression, and performance. Ms. Marfatia answered with great warmth and encouraged the students to find their own unique form of expression. She also presented a visual presentation that provided insights into classical, contemporary, and folk-dance forms. The presentation included images, symbolic gestures, and performance videos, enriching the audience's understanding of how dance can serve as a language beyond words. Following the presentation, she performed a live sequence without music, using only facial expressions, mudras, and body movements to tell a story beautifully bringing her message to life.
- The session concluded with a group photo capturing the memories and the learning spirit of the day.
